

#### **Dr. Denis McGee Receives Iowa Seed Association's Highest Honor**

During the ISA convention held on November 1 & 2, 2005, President Lamka announced Dr. Denis McGee as the latest recipient of its highest honor, the Honorary Member Award. Dr. McGee was recognized for his contributions during the ISA's annual convention held in Ames, Iowa.

The Honorary Member award began in 1949 and is presented to a person who has had a significant impact on the seed industry and who has served as part of the ISA with distinction. Dr. McGee served as a long time supporter of the Iowa seed industry.

Dr. McGee earned a B.S. degree in Botany in 1964 and a Ph.D. in Plant Pathology in 1967, from the University of Edinburgh. After receiving his Ph.D., he then earned his post-doctoral study at the University of Minnesota. In 1978 he joined the Department of Plant Pathology and the Seed Science Center at ISU and was promoted to Professor in 1984. Dr. McGee has written two books on seed diseases of corn and soybeans, published in 1988 and 1992. He also played a central role in the development of a comprehensive database on Seedborne Diseases. In recent years, Dr. McGee has worked on national and international phytosanitary issues and has been part of a committee that works with industry, government and regulatory agencies.

## **Biotechnology Update Biosciences Alliance of Iowa Funds ISU Research**

The Biosciences Alliance of Iowa (BAI) has awarded funding to two projects at Iowa State University that are designed to advance the state's bioscience industry. BAI was formed by the Iowa Department of Economic Development to enhance the state's effort in key agricultural and medical areas. BAI awarded \$700,000 to Iowa State to establish the Human Nutrition Wellness Research Center. The center will evaluate the safety and efficacy of new foods, food ingredients or dietary supplements developed by Iowa-based companies. Funding will be used to purchase equipment and complete minor renovations to a building in the ISU Research Park.

## **ISU Scientists Share in \$29.5 Million Project to Sequence Maize Genome**

Iowa State University is one of four institutions on the team selected for a \$29.5 million, three-year project to sequence the maize (corn) genome, the most complex genome to be sequenced to date. Sequencing a genome reveals an organism's genetic blueprint and opens the door for researchers to discover the role each gene plays in the life of the organism. Completion of the corn genome will allow scientists to more efficiently develop corn varieties for specific conditions and uses.

## **LaVigne tapped to lead American Seed Trade Association**

The Board of Directors of the American Seed Trade Association (ASTA) is pleased to announce the election of Andrew W. LaVigne as the organization's new President and CEO. LaVigne replaces outgoing President and CEO Dick Crowder, who was recently confirmed as the new Chief Agriculture Negotiator in the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative.

"The ASTA Board is very pleased that Andy has chosen to accept this position," said Jim Tobin, ASTA Chairman. "He brings to our association an extensive and accomplished history of leadership in the legislative, regulatory and trade arenas that will allow us to build on the past successes of ASTA. Our industry is poised to address several critical issues in the next couple of years and Andy has the established record and relationships to help ensure our successful completion of those challenges."

LaVigne has been the Executive Director and CEO of Florida Citrus Mutual for the past seven years. Prior to joining Mutual, LaVigne was the Executive Director of the Florida Fertilizer and Agrichemical Association for over four years. He also spent a decade in Washington, D.C. working in Congress and at USDA.

ASTA, founded in 1993, is one of the oldest trade organizations in the United States. Its membership consists of about 850 companies involved in seed production, distribution, plant breeding and related industries in North America. As an authority in plant germplasm, ASTA advocates science and policy issues on industry-wide importance.

LaVigne will assume the President and CEO duties at the beginning of February 2006.
